Avoid public Wi-Fi – Never shop or bank online using open networks in malls or coffee shops; these are easy targets for hackers.

Be cautious of phishing scams – Fraudsters often send fake emails or messages that appear legitimate. Avoid clicking on suspicious links.

Use strong passwords – Combine uppercase letters, symbols, and numbers to create a secure password of at least eight characters.

Activate two-factor authentication – OTPs and authentication apps provide essential extra protection for your accounts.
